Agreeably to a Resolution of the General Assembly the Board took into Consideration the application of Roger Skivington late a Soldier in the Maryland line, who appears by the documents in the Auditors Office to be returned missing on the 16th of August 1780, on which day he alledges he was wounded and taken prisoner, and finding that he is unable by any Kind of testimony to account for never having rejoined the Army, or for having so long [p. 248] deferred presenting his claim, are of opinion that the terms of the Resolution aforesaid do not permit them to direct the issuing [of] Certificates of depreciation on his pay until by the testimony of his Officers, or by some other means he gives a more Satisfactory account of himself from that time.
