## A Proclamation

Whereas at a General Court for the western shore of the State of Maryland on the tenth day of May last a certain Thomas Hadfield late of Baltimore County Merchant was indicted for the Murder of David Sterett of the same County Merchant; And Whereas the Peace Dignity and well being of the State require that such Measures should be adopted as may probably effect the arrest of the said Thomas Hadfield so that he may be put upon his trial for the said Offence I do therefore by the advice and consent of the Council issue this my Proclamation requiring all civil Officers and other good Citizens of this State to apprehend the said Thomas Hadfield and to bring him before some Judge or Justice within the said State to dealt with according to Law.

Given at Annapolis under the Seal of the State of Maryland this eighth Day of June in the

year of our Lord one thousand [p. 310] seven hundred and ninety one.
