Neutrality of the United States, and with their assistance to take prudent, and if need, vigorous measures for the purpose of carrying into effect the Object of the President of the United States as expressed in the above recited letters, the said John Kilty Esquire being hereby constituted the representative of the Executive power of this [p. 257] State for the aforesaid purpose, and being vested with full power to effect the views of the federal Executive so far as this Board has authority to confer the same.
