Friday 2d. October 1789

The Council met.

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Randolph Brandt Latimer Ten pounds, eight shillings and four pence for one Months Salary as Deputy Auditor due the 1st. June last, and also the further sum of Forty one pounds, thirteen shillings and four pence for two Months Salary as Auditor General due the 1st. of August last.

James Jackson formerly a Subject of the King of Great Britain appeared before the Board and Voluntarily made, repeated and subscribed a Declaration of his Belief in the Christian Religion, and also took repeated and subscribed the Oath prescribed by the "Act for Naturalization," wherefore he is now become a Subject of this State.

Upon the payment of between Eight and Nine hundred pounds, the Sales of Samuel Groome Osborn's, and his Securities property for the Collection of the taxes in Harford County for the year 1786, will be postponed until [p. 103] the 23d. instant of which the Agent will be directed to give Notice.
