That the Said Treasurer pay to Capt. Robert Denny Thirty one pounds five Shillings for one Quarter's Salary as deputy Auditor due him the 1st. Instant.

[p. 115] The General Assembly of Maryland on Monday the sixteenth Day of November seventeen hundred and eighty nine having unanimously rechosen John Eager Howard Esquire Governor for the ensuing year, his Excellency attended in the Senate room and qualified in presence of the Members of the General Assembly by taking the several Oaths required by the Constitution and Form of Government and the Laws of this State and by subscribing a Declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion.

On Tuesday following and seventeenth day of the same Month, the General Assembly proceeded to the choice of the Council to the Governor, when John Kilty, James Brice, John Davidson, William Hindman and Randolph Brandt Latimer Esquires were elected.
