

Warrant, and he supposed that the keeping the road the width it had been kept for many years, was all that was required of him, that he is poor and has a large family to maintain: He therefore prays a remission of the said fine, And five of the Justices of the said County having certified that from the best of their information the facts stated in the Petition are true and that the said Isaac Landen ought not to have been fined, though the Law obliged them to give [p. 119] judgment against him: The Board taking all the Circumstances into Consideration, do order and direct that the said fine of five hundred pounds of Tobacco be remitted.
