Preamble reciting the Act of 1697, ch.

HEREAS, at a General Affembly, held at the Port of Annapolis, the Twenty-fixth Day of May One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-seven, a certain Act of Assembly was made, entitled, An AEt impowering the Commissioners of each respective County to purchase Lands for the Use of their respective Courts, which is now executed.

II. Be it Enacted, by the Queen's most ex ellent Majesty, by and with the Ad-Purchases of Lands under vice and Consent of her Majesty's Governor, Council, and Assembly of this Prothat Act convince, and the Authority of the Jame, That what Purchases of Lands the Comfirmed. missioners had made according to the said Act, for the Use of the respective Counties, and recorded within the feveral and respective County Courts whereunto they properly belong, shall be a perpetual Bar against him, her, or them, from whom the Land was purchased, and against all Persons claiming by, from, or under him, her, them, or any of them, for ever.
