Passed 26th An ACT for the Encouragement of Learning, and erecting O&ober 1723. Schools in the feveral Counties within this Province. Lib. LL. N° 4. fol. 602.

Preamble.

HEREAS the preceding Assemblies for some Years past have had much at Heart the absolute Necessity they have lain under, in regard both to Duty and Interest, to make the best Provision in their Power for the liberal and pious Education of the Youth of this Province, and improving their natural Abilities and Accuteness, (which seems not to be inferior to any) so as to be fitted for the Discharge of their Duties in the several Stations and Employments they may be called to, and employed in, either in regard to Church or State; and for that End laid an Imposition on fundry Commodities exported out of, and others imported into, this Province, and other Fines, for the raising a Fund for the erecting and supporting a good School in each County within this Province, which has succeeded with fuch defired Effect, that it is now thought necessary, and is prayed that it may be Enacted,

II. And be it Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor, by and to be erected with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That in some convenient Time, after the End of this present Session of Assembly, there shall (for the Ends before mentioned) be erected One School in each County within this Province, at the most convenient Place, as near the Center of the County as may be, and as may be most convenient for the Boarding of Children, at the Discretion of the Visitors, or the major Part of them, that are hereafter nominated, appointed and impowered by this Act, in each County.

III. And he it therefore Enacted, by the Authority, Advice, and Consent a-Seven Vifitors appoint-foresaid, That for the Time being, the Seven several Persons hereafter named ed for each for each County, be, and are hereby nominated, appointed, and named Visi-County. tors, and are impowered with full and sufficient Authority for discharging the several Offices, Duties and Trusts, reposed in and required of them by this Act, within the several and respective Counties wherein they reside, (That is to say),
