CHAP. XXVI. The Oath which fhall be taken by all Persons importing Servants into

Masters of Vessels, and other Persons whatsoever, bringing any Servant or Servants into this Province, by Land or Water, shall only be obliged to declare to the Naval Officer of the Port or District, into which such Servant or Servants shall be imported or brought, upon Oath (or Affirmation if a Quaker) "To the best of their Knowledge, whether such Servant or Servants be then " under the Sentence of Transportation, and if so, for what Offence, and the Term this Province. " of Years they have to serve;" any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary thereof, in any wife notwithstanding.

N. B. By this Act, (instead of the Bounds settled by the Act of 1727, ch. 9,) the Bounds of the faid Two Acres are declared to be as follow, viz. Beginning at the N. E. Corner of the Chapel aforefaid; and running E. to William Ennalls's Ditch; then S. 38° W. Twelve Perches; then W. 38° N. Twenty Perches; then N. 38° E. Sixteen Perches; then E. 38° S. Twenty Perches, to the said Ditch, then bounding therewith, 'til it intersects the aforesaid East Line drawn from the faid Chapel, containing Two Acres of Land. The Vestry to run the said Lines, and place One Cedar Post at each Corner of the same, and enter the Lines and Plat in their Register Book of the said Parish; and when so compleated, the said Bounds to remain for the suture, the undoubted Bounds of the faid Two Acres of Land for ever.
