Preamble. **W**HEREAS notwithstanding the Laws heretofore made for the Preservation of Harbours and Landing Places, within this Province, Masters of Ships and Vessels, and Others having the Charge or Command of Ships and Vessels, have caused or suffered great Quantities of Ballast,
