tinuance in the said Office, transmit to the Trustees residing at London, for  
the Time being, agreeable to the Directions of an Act, entitled, *An Act*  
*for emitting and making Current Ninety Thousand Pounds Current Money of*  
*Maryland, in Bills of Credit*, good Bills of Exchange; and Account for,  
and Pay to, the Treasurer or Treasurers for the Time being, from Time  
to Time, the several Sums of Money which he the said Naval Officer shall  
receive by the Laws of this Province, on Account of the Public;" which  
Obligation or Obligations shall be no ways affected by the Act of Limita-  
tions; any Law, Usage, or Custom, to the contrary in any wise notwith-  
standing. Which said Justice or Justices, taking such Bond as aforesaid, shall  
be, and he or they are hereby directed and obliged, to lodge such Bond or  
Bonds with the Clerk of the Council for the Time being, in the Council  
Office, there to be kept.

Money thereby arising to be applied towards purchasing another Piece of Ground within the  
City, and erecting thereon a new Market-house for the Use of the said City.

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS several Inhabitants of Frederick County, by their hum-  
ble Petition to this General Assembly, have set forth, That there  
is a convenient Place for a Town on Patowmack River, above the  
Mouth of Rock Creek, adjacent to the Inspection House in the County afore-  
said; and prayed, that Sixty Acres of Land may be there Laid out and Erec-  
ted into a Town.

II. Be it therefore Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary,  
by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and  
Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That Capt. Henry  
Wright Crabb, Master John Needham, Master John Clagett, Master James  
Perrie, Master Samuel Magruder the Third, Master Josias Bealle, and Master  
David
