

The Condition of this Obligation is Such that if the aboue bounden John Blackmore or his assignes Shall with his above S^d Ship Sail from hence directly for Some Port of Engd: Wailes o[r] Town of Berwick upon Tweed and Shall there unload and put on Shoar as Such Tobaccoes as Shall be loaden on board his Said this p^rSent Voyage (the danger of the Seas excepted) and Shall also well and truly pay or cause to be paid their Ma^{ts} Dues Duties and Customes due and payable for the Same according to Law and Shall also within twelve months from the date hereof produce or cause to be produced here to their Ma^{ts} Collector of this Port of Pattuxent a Certificate from the Collect^r or Cheif Officer of their Ma^{ts} Customes of Such Port of England Wales or Berwick as afore Said Where he Shall unloade as afore Said: Then this Obligation to be Void otherwise to stand remain and be in full force and Vertue.

Which Said Bond and first Reason aforementioned being fully argued and debated upon by the Councill on both Sides and the Act of Parliam^t produced and read upon which the Said information was grounded, It is the Judgm^t of this Court that the Said bond is not a good bond in Law, according to the Said Act and therefore considered by the Court here this day (to witt the 21st day of May Anno 1695: that the Said Judgm^t for the reasons afore Said be set aside and reversed and that the Said Edw^d Randolph who as well etc: be unto all things (he hath thereby lost) restored.
