The King v Phillip Llynes.

MARYLAND ss. Phillip Llynes late of Charles County otherwise called Phillip Llynes of St Mary's County Gent<sup>n</sup> was Sumoned to answer unto our Sovereigne Lord the King One thousand pounds Currant money of England Which to our said Lord the King he oweth and unjustly detaineth.

And Whereupon George Plater Attorney Generall for our said Lord the King who etc. prosecuteth and saith that the said Phillip Lynes the Seaventh day of Aprill in the year of our Lord One thousand Six hundred Eighty eight At S<sup>t</sup> Marys County aforesaid by his certain bond or writing obligatory sealed with the seale of him the said Phillip and here in Court produced whose date is the day and Year aforesaid did acknowledge himself
