

per hundred but whether Sterling or Currency he Cant remember and being askt what he loakt upon to be the height of Tob^o time that year Saith about May or June And being further askt if he remembers that M^r Brice refus'd to Accept of any Tob^o that the Compls offer'd him on Acc^t of Said Note Saith no And this Dep^t further Saith that he attended Said Brice in his Store and recd Tob^o for him that year And this Dep^t being Askd by the Compl^t whether he remembers if M^r Brice did not Decline receiving Tob^o at Such time as the [415] Coleman Friggott did not take in all the Tob^o Saith that he Cannott Charge his Memory therewth, And further Saith that the Said Ship Coleman Friggott did not take in all the Tob^o purchased by Said Brice towards her Loading that year And that he beleives the Said Ship Sailed that year about July and being askt by the Compl^t whether he was asidious in receiving tob^o purchased by Bills of Exch^a for that Laid out in the Store Saith he Cannott remember whether he was or no. And being Askd by the Def^t whether he knew of any other Tob^o bought by M^r Brice that year — Saith he remembers M^r Brice bought ab^t 19000th Tob^o of Capt Rich^d Jones and Sam^l Chambers ab^t the Same time towards Loading S^d Ship for w^{ch} he gave them 10^s Ster and Nine pence Curr^t money per hundred And further Saith not.

M^r Samuel Chambers being Sworne (on the part of the Def^t) To true answer make to all Such Questions as Should be askt him by Compl^t or Defendant and being askt what he remembers of M^r Brice's Purchaseing of Tob^o of Cap^t Richard Jones and him this Dep. and the Discourse that Happened between them Saith that he remembers Said Brice purchased of him this Dep^t and Cap^t Jones about 19000^t tobacco w^{ch} they had purchased of M^r Wooton rector of S^t Ann's Parish and the Dep^t beleives Said Sume was due to S^d Wooton for the 40 per pooll as Minister of Said parish for w^{ch} he paid them 10^s Sterling and Nine pence Curr^t Money per hundred and after the purchase thereof in the Same day Said Brice S^d that he was oblig'd to purchase of them because having Tob^o in the Sheriffs hands he Could not get his paid in Said Parish untill the Tob^o Sold by Said Dep^t and Cap^t Jones was recd And that he beleives the Said Brices reason for purchaseing Said Tob^o was because it was Convenient for him in Said Parish And the Dep^t further Saith that in the fall following after the purchase of Said Tob^o M^r Brice Said he was very Sorry he purchased Said tob^o of them for that he was looser One hundred pounds on Acc^t Said Bargain. And this Dep^t further Saith that about Feb^y or March 1709 Cap^t Jones Told this Dep^t he had been at the Compl^{ts} and the Said Compl^t had promis'd him if they bought the Tob^o of Wooton he wou'd pay it Convenient in the parish but Says he never had any order [416] from the Compl^t for the payment thereof, and further Said that the Compl^t told him that he the Said Compl^t had ordered Thomas Reynolds his undersherr to gett the Said Tob^o ready for their Receiving w^{ch} time he beleives to be before the Arrivall of the Coleman Friggott.
