The Justices of the Prov<sup>th</sup> Court of the province of Maryland Transmitt to his L<sup>d</sup>ships High Court of Appeales and Errors held before his Ex<sup>ty</sup> the Gov<sup>n</sup> and his L<sup>d</sup>ships Hon<sup>bte</sup> Councill at the City of Annapolis the following Record on an Appeale made by Thomas Bordley and Daniel Dulany who for us Prosecuteth from the said Provin<sup>l</sup> Court the tenor of which, follows in these words (Viz<sup>t</sup>)

MARYLAND ss<sup>t</sup> At a Provinciall Court held at the City of Annapolis in the County of Annarundell for the Province of Maryland on the third tuesday of September being the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the same month in the 5<sup>th</sup> year of the Dom<sup>n</sup> of the R<sup>t</sup> Hon<sup>bte</sup> Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon L<sup>d</sup> Baron of Baltemore etc: Annoque Domi 1720.

MARYLAND ss. Thomas Lingan, late of Calvert County Gent: als dict, Thomas Lingan was Summonsed to answer unto his Lordship the Hon<sup>bte</sup> the L<sup>d</sup> Prop<sup>ry</sup> of a plea that he render unto him five hundred pounds Sterling which to him he Oweth and unjustly detaineth etc: And whereupon Thomas Bordley Esq<sup>r</sup> his L<sup>d</sup>ships Attorney Gen<sup>l</sup> who for his Lordship prosecuteth Saith that whereas the afs<sup>d</sup> Thomas Lingan the nineth day of May in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and Eeighteen [sic] at Annarundell County by his Certain Writeing Obligatory did Acknowledge himself to be holden and firmly bound unto his said L<sup>d</sup>ship in the afs<sup>d</sup> five hundred pounds to be paid to his said L<sup>d</sup>ship when afterwards he shou<sup>d</sup> be thereunto required Nevertheless the afs<sup>d</sup> Thomas Lingan altho Often required the afs<sup>d</sup> five hundred pounds to the said Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> hath not rendered but the same to him to render hath refused and Still doth refuse to the damage of the said Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> one Thousand Pounds Sterling money as afs<sup>d</sup> and this the said Thomas Bordley for the said Lord Prop<sup>ry</sup> is ready to verifie etc., and he brings here into Court the writeing Obligatory afs<sup>d</sup> which Testifies the Debt afs<sup>d</sup> in form afs<sup>d</sup> whose date is the day and year above said. The Condition of the above Obligation is such that if the above bound Thomas Lingan Ex<sup>r</sup> of all and Singular the Goods Chattles and Credits of Edward Boteler late of Calvert County deced do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and Singular of the goods Chattles and Credits
