Afterw^{ds} To Witt the Same 21st day of July the S^d Thomas Bordley moved for Repl^t or Exceptions to be filed within ten days of the then Next Court According to the practice on the following rule. Viz^t That all Bills on Injunctions be filed ten days before the first Court after the Appearance and that where this Rule is Complied with the answer be filed ten Days before The Ensueing Court and So of all other proceedings. But for that it Seemed to his Honour the Chancellor that by the Rule af^d the S^d Thomas Bordley was not oblidged to file his answer Untill Within Ten days of the S^d then Next Court nor the Complainant to reply untill within Ten days of the Succeeding Court Therefore the S^d Motion Was overruled and Ordered Repl^t or Exception to be filed within Ten Days of Such Succeeding Court but ordered that the Demurrer to the Said Bill Stand for Argument in December Court Next.

And Thereupon the Cause Stands Continued Untill the first Tuesday of December being the Seventeenth day of the Same Month Anno Dom 1725 from Which S^d first Tuesday of December the Said Cause Stood Continued Untill the third Tuesday of Febry then Next on which S^d third Tuesday of February being the 15 Day of the Same Month Anno Dom 1725 Comes as well the S^d Complainant by his Councill as the S^d Defendant in his proper person and it was further Considered by Consent of both parties that the Hearing and Argument upon the Bill Answer and Demurrer Should be the last Day of March Anno Dom 1726

Memorandum That the Consent of both parties Mentioned in the above Rule was by Patrick Sympson the Agent for the Complainant and by William Cumming the Councill assigned the Complainant at the S^d Sympsons request on the one part and the Defendant in person on the other part

Which S^d Cause Standing upon hearing and Argument upon bill Answer and Demurrer the S^d Last Day of March Anno Domini 1726 (according to the rule made in Febry Court before Anno Dom 1725) at which S^d Last day of March the S^d Cause Standing as before for hearing and Argument
