That W^m Brewerton and his Wife Executed the Deed mentioned in this Dep^{ts} Deposition for Compl^t as freely and Willingly Seemingly as ever this Dep^t Saw any person Execute One.

John Handy Levin Gale

Mary Maccleane of Stepney Parish in Somersett County Sworn and Examined on the part of the Def^t Saith as follows Viz^t.

M^r Adams did [sic] bring W^m Brewerton to their house nor Speake to them to Entertain him W^m Brewerton did Come and ask this Dep^t for the key of the Room Door and this Dep^t give it him and he went in this Dep^t Asked the reason of his Coming there and he Said for fear of the Sherriff on whose Acc^t this Dep^t knows not M^r Adams gave the Dep^t a paper w^{ch} this Dep^t Laid up till M^r Adams Called for it again then this Dep^t delivered the Same M^r Sam^l Handy and Captⁿ Joseph Macclester being there at the Same Time W^m Brewerton with a paper in his hand Called M^r Adams into the room and this Dep^t heard W^m Brewerton Say to M^r Adams he was well Satisfied with the paper M^r Adams answered he was glad of it and dont blame me hereafter but what it was this Dep^t knows not but M^r Adams told this Depon^t that there was John Evans Alienation and W^m Brewertons alienation and bid this Dep^t Lay em up this Dep^t and Donald Maccleane were together at the Same Time

John Handy Levin Gale.

Donald Maccleane of Stepney Parish in Somersett County and Examined for the Def^t Saith as follows Viz^t

1st That after the Compl^t Commenced his Action at Law Ag^t the Def^t Brewerton the S^d Brewerton Came to the house of the Dep^t and Stayed there to keep out of the way of the Sherriff as this Dep^t Apprehended but that the Def^t Adams did Neither bring the Said Brewerton to the S^d Dep^{ts} house nor desired the Dep^t to Entertain him.

2^{dly} That the Def^t Brewerton while he was at the Dep^{ts} house was no way Confined (but had the Key of the Room in his own Custody) nor did the S^d Brewerton desire the Dep^t to Deny him if the Sherr Came and Demanded whether he was there
