grams. You have before you now the first extensive study in depth of a comprehensive plan for community mental health services. Those of us who are interested in seeing a plan developed to improve our program for the treatment, care and rehabilitation of the victims of mental disorders are hopeful that this conference, with its truly impressive array of knowledge, understanding and experience, will chart the course that we are to follow in the years ahead. As I express to you my sincere appreciation for the interest you are showing in the problems of mental health in Maryland, may I also solicit the continued support of all of you in the effort that is being made to alleviate the distress of mental illness and mental retardation in our great State.

REMARKS WELCOMING VISTA VISITORS BALTIMORE

January 5, 1966
