I don't think this is a necessity in obtaining equality in the housing field. I think it opens a Pandora's box of abuses and intrusions into areas where government should stay out.

A. I would think I would unless there was some very unusual reason for not following the recommendation. I think this is a good way to assist the Governor in screening the candidates. Who would know more about the activity and the dedication of an individual in the area of education than those who are working in it on a day to day basis? This doesn't mean that I would forgo the right to depart from those lists if I thought there was a very good reason for doing so. But I'm persuaded to try to stay within lists unless there is an excellent reason to depart from them.
