Sworne saith; I went along with Mr. Elzey and Colonel Starburch to
cartroone pointe and then they left the Company and
began to survey and came up the neck as far as the
Cross fence and then I left them; and they went for
ward how far they went I doe not knowe, but when
they came againe they said Mr. Hewells Land was
farr as the trading brance where the trading brance
is I doe not knowe, And while after Mr. Hewells farm
went to feate upon the neck that is called the flode and
John Johnson was to goe and live with him and further
saith not;

John Johnson Negro appeared before the Court the 3rd of July present
And before the taking of Rib Sand the Commissioners asked
him whether he had bin baptizd the said John Johnson
made answer he was baptizd; Afterward they asked him
if he did rightly understand the taking of an Oath the said
John Johnson gave them a satisfactory answer & was permitted
to swear in the cause depending

Sworne saith for matter of any surveying I have nowe only a
Record some that were there (which was Robert Brights)
that they did run the line along the back creeke and there
was there markt some where about the old fields against
Thomas Davis; And he said that was the Road Lane of
Colonell Starburch; and further saith not;
