

The Deposition of James Davis aged thirty two years or thereabouts
taken in Court the 3rd of August 1670

Sworne Saith That he hath heard Mr. Revell say that a piece of Land lies over
in the Indian neck, that which you call the Lower Neck and
hears Mr. Revell say that he would have Mr. Henry survey it
for Capt. Glanville, but did hear Mr. Revell say that he did
let him have that Land; Gentlemen when I came up first
there came up with me Capt. Bridger and George Nafworthey
to take up some Land in this province and inquired of Mr. Revell
whether he would give them a light for any Land to take up, upon
which Mr. Revell wished them to go along with him to Wincomere
when they came there, George Nafworthey did not like, saying
Mr. Revell I will let you have some of my Land, Mr. Revell being
going for Anson's desired Mr. Revell to go along with him and
myself into the Indian neck to show him a piece of Land
there; so we went with Mr. Revell to the first ford; it being
late in the afternoon I being unwilling to go any further;
persuaded him to go no further, but let some of his men go
along with Mr. Nafworthey which they did and showed him and
when he came back again Mr. Revell asked him how he liked it
and he said very well and further saith not;

The Cause depending is referred till to Morrow
and ordered that the Jury give their attendance here
to hear the Deposition of above Shinnest
