which I suppose was drawn by m^r Jenifer the deed not
perfected nor signed passing the said deed I asked m^r Revell
whether he would sign it or not; I saying that I never saw
such a charge warranted before me; I neither then said m^r Revell
I presently asked m^r Stanwile what he paid for the draft he
told me to be value of about of tobacco as I take it I then
said if it be yo^r desired I will draw a conveyance for one
hundred & fifty pounds tobacco and perfect it; m^r Revell
replied I presently doe it; Accordingly I drew draft
m^r Revell giving me the bounds of his land then intended
to be made over to Capt^e Stanwile as I suppose; being approved
of the fowle draft which I drew out saying which m^r Revell
did signe seals and deliver to m^r Stanwile; and m^r Revell did
