It is shewed upon the said James Hudson's oath that the said

thirty pounds of tobacco & Cash the same tobacco being  
long since due is still unsatisfied whereupon James  
Hudson saith he is damaged & hath lost & thereupon  
bringeth his suit &c

The pl. saith his bill is read as follows

This bill bindeth me Thomas David of Maryland Carpenter my  
heirs executors or administrators to pay or cause to be paid  
unto James Hudson of Potomack his executors or assigns  
the summe of four hundred & thirty pounds merchantable  
tobacco & Cash for valuable consideration received to be  
made good in the hands of me John White of Potomack upon  
demand in writing whereof I have received six my own
