in plea of debt

Thomas Miller saith by Henry Smith that James Mills

standeth indebted to Thomas Miller the summe of foure  
hundred sixty foure pounds of tobacco without ground  
Leaves or grounds to be paid by the said James Mills

at the house of Mr Edward Russell in Capt. Charles  
paysent the said Mills binds himselfe his heirs executors  
administrators assigns as by bill under the hand and  
seal of the Court doth appear, the said bill bearing

date the 12<sup>th</sup> day of November 1668 the said debt being  
often demanded yett still not satisfied, the said Mills  
having absented himselfe & not to be met withall

therefore the Miller being his suite being dampned  
for want of his tobacco craves order for attachment  
of the said foure hundred sixty foure pounds of tobacco

with cost of suite in the hands of Benjamin Lawrence  
Mr Henry Smith delivers the bill in Court read as followeth

The bill bindeth the said James Mills of whatsoeuer  
executors administrators or assigns to pay or cause to be paid  
unto Thomas Miller or his assigns the full summe of

foure hundred & sixty foure pounds of sound merchantable  
tobacco without ground leaves or grounds at the house of Mr  
Edward
