The defend: agreed that they be allowed though not
now taken before the Jury.

The Deposition of German Gillett taken before m^r John
Blindert 9th day of August 1670

Swoorne saith Aboute foureteen years since I was trading in Manooki
river from Rappahannock with one William Cooper who
was my Interpreter when he had me drive or two in the
river he left me in the sloop and went by Land and found
an Indian two dayes after for me and the sloop to come
up, and I asked why he sent for me so far up the river
he said that we might come up to the trading branch,
or else we could not have any trade with them, which is
the second branch from the main C^o house, and about
halfe a mile up the branch we took in what time we
dealt with them, for and further saith not.

The Deposition of Christopher Miller aged thirty four years
or thereabouts taken before m^r John Blindert 9th day of Aug 1670

Swoorne saith That the Indian told me that the branch where
the stump is about the middle of the mouth of the branch
going into the trading branch, that m^r Hooper and
m^r Cooper with severall others did trade at and further
saith not.

The Deposition of Richard Bird aged forty nine years or thereabouts
taken before m^r John Blindert 9th day of August 1670

Swoorne saith That the second branch on the south side of Manooki river
from the main C^o house upward where there is great
stump aboute the middle of the branch going in and
above of stables where there are some Indian houses
this is the trading branch that I have known to be
fourteen years
