Boston the 24th of 7th 1670

Honored freind M^r Revell

I: My real intent was to see you face to face this winter but
providence hath prevented me for my body brought so low
by violent cold which I took about ten dayes agoe & it
brought me into a fever and Agues fitts so that I am not
Capable of coming at present therefore have made bold
to be troublesome thus once craving yo^r favourable assistance
in the p^rmisses which are as follow: I have sent you a letter
of Attorney whereby you have full power to sell the plantation
Stephen Bond is come over on purpose to sit downe himselfe
and especially one M^r Murrells from Barbadoes to buy my
Halter which if he doe and will give a Convenient price and
make good pay lett him have it I Judge it may be worth
tenne thousand pounds of Tobacco stock and all that belongs
to it but if I misse it I leave it to yo^r discretion to moderate
as you see meete there is a young man of Boston that hath
been treating with me about it and if he have an opportunity
he will come over and see it his name is Ephraim Turner
he bid me forty pounds in money for it if he like it when
he sees it if he cannot and like of it lett him give you
good security for the payment of the forty pounds in money
here in Boston and give him a Conveyance for the same
of the whole not of any particular part except Stephen
Bond the party buying doe agree to divide and if not of
