John Harris then indicted by the name of John Harris  
Labourer of the County of Middlesex do find in the County of Middlesex  
that thou not having the fear of God before thy eyes did  
fraudulently on purpose to deceive falsly pack and put  
up into the ship of tobacco stalks piggis and trash of tobacco  
and paid it away for good tobacco contrary to the statute of the  
said Proprietary rule and dignity;

The Col<sup>d</sup> demanded whether he was guilty or not guilty  
the said John Harris made answer not guilty and  
Grand Jury

The Col<sup>d</sup> orders Arthur Saiter to be imprisoned
