And whereupon the said Richard Till for himselfe saith that  
 he the said Thomas Woolfson did upon the seventeenth day  
 of February in the xxxi<sup>th</sup> year of the Dominion of the  
 R<sup>ty</sup> Hon<sup>ble</sup> Cecilius or demog<sup>o</sup> Domini our Thousand six  
 hundred and seventytwo; agree Covenant & promise  
 to bind with him the said Richard Till from the day afores<sup>d</sup>  
 untill the last day of November next coming, the

said Thomas Woolfson to doe singe service as the said R<sup>ty</sup>  
 Till should employ him in digging the said terme and  
 at the expiration of the said terme the said Richard Till  
 was to pay or cause to be paid the summe or quantity  
 of eight hundred pounds of tobacco and two barrells of  
 corn and during the said terme the said Richard was  
 to provide for the said Thomas Woolfson and the Child of the  
 said Thomas Woolfson sufficient meate drink Lodging  
 and washing allwaies provided and excepted that if in  
 case the said Child should not live to the last of November  
 the said Thomas was to have no more from what is before  
 specified paid him at the expiration of his service, the  
 Child of the said Thomas since dying in the x<sup>th</sup>
