The Declaration of the Peace the 1st day of Aug: 1673 in open Court
 said Robert miller was at my house in Albin room with Henry
 Boston wife that is now, the Indian King standing at the door
 offering the woman for Albin of tape I think to live in his
 house and at length Robert miller said you dog stand
 away he would be fowle of him the King hearing him
 call King dog he went up and down keeping Albin
 King dog Robert miller came out with a bull's pizzle
 to strike him George Johnson stood between & said
 pretty Robbin don't strike the King and upon that
 presently struck George in the face by the blood run down
