 or thereabouts deposes here in Court  
 to the best of my remembrance & paine I heard m<sup>r</sup> Lappage  
 say severall times in the house of m<sup>r</sup> Randall Revell that  
 Mary Margaret which did belong to William Burris he  
 sold for four years and no longer soe farre & say and  
 farther saye not Elizabeth Winged

 which is Common Runaway therefore these are to give  
 notice to all persons that no person whatsoever shall receive  
 forward apprehend the said servant boy nor bring him home  
 if he should be seen away not upon the art<sup>l</sup> of demanding  
 pay according to Act of Assembly but if any doe bring him  
 home at any time out of home you will oblige him who is  
 yo<sup>r</sup> friend to bring you in Life Tho: Bloyes
