The Deposition of Henry Leijnes being aged
 Twenty three or thereabouts

Saith John Barbe was to give John Bewley fower thousand
 pounds of tobacco for the year onely to keepe his books
 whereby he was Acquainted of dyvare of the time
 And further sd. Deponent saith that John Bewley and
 John Marshall they went to Kent for two hundred
 gallons of Cyder in about 15th was in Robbins lye upon
 the 1st
