Maryland vs Thomas Woolson Late of Somerset County of Virginia  
 called Thomas Woolson of the County of Somers<sup>et</sup> plant<sup>er</sup>  
 was summoned to answer unto John Avery in a

And the said John for himselfe saith that the sd<sup>r</sup> Tho: Woolson by  
 second day of April one thousand six hundred seventy &  
 one became indebted unto him the summe of nine hundred &  
 twenty pounds of good sound merchantable tobacco in cash  
 to be paid the tenth day of October next ensuing 1701  
 in some convenient place in Newmarket viz<sup>t</sup> at the sd<sup>r</sup> B. & A  
 here in Co<sup>l</sup> ordered to the w<sup>th</sup> payment he bindeth himselfe  
 his heirs executors & adm<sup>rs</sup> as above the summe of seven
