And the Aforesaid George Johnson by William Compton
 his Attorney Cometh and defendeth himselfe and saith
 That the said Randall Revell his anon brought not to
 him for he did neither force nor drive any Cow of
 Revells to his Plantation but A strange Cow came to his
 plantation And thenceof gave Notice by Note sent up at
 the Co^{ts} House of the said Court being there yet no owner
 came to Lay Right Claim to her, The said strange Cow breaking
 into the Cornfield of the Defendants and leading thereof
 Cattle of the Def^{ts} to his great Loss That he was forced to
 Kill the said Cow the said Cow being appoyled by two
 Rouse men And that they pray enquired may be by the
 Court; Therefore it is Comanded the Sheriffe of
 this County to summon A Jury to come here of Twelve
 whom are sworn, vizt; William Jones, Cornelius
 Johnson, David Spence, Samuel Barber, George
 Smith, Francis Roberts, William Furnish
 James
