 paying the aforesaid thousand pounds of tobacco as  
 yo<sup>r</sup> petitioner had occasion for but the said David  
 Spence denying to pay according to condition that  
 yo<sup>r</sup> petitioner is like to suffer for want of lodging  
 therefore yo<sup>r</sup> petitioner prays ord<sup>r</sup> that the s<sup>d</sup> Spence  
 should perform the said indenture according to  
 intent & meaning it bearing date the first of  
 September one thousand six hundred seventy &  
 three And your Petitioner shall Pray for  
 you as he is in duty bound

And the aforesaid David Spence by Will  
 Tompson his Attorney Committed & defending  
 himselfe did saith that the said Isaac  
 Lindson hath no cause of Complaint the  
 def<sup>t</sup> having their agreement here made  
 in Co<sup>rt</sup> to be produced w<sup>it</sup> he is ready
