will appear (herein <sup>co<sup>l</sup></sup> produced signed with the hand of him the  
said John Anderson bearing date the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October Anno  
Domini one thousand six hundred eighty eight did Assume upon  
himselfe and Promise to pay unto the s<sup>d</sup> George Parker his heirs  
executors or assigns the s<sup>d</sup> quantity of tobaco aforesaid, vizt; one thousand  
pounds of tobaco the same yeare and the other one thousand pounds  
of tobaco the yeare after the date of the said writing in Perambok river  
& for the performance whereof the said John bindeth himselfe his heirs  
& executors; But he the said John hath regarding his Promise &  
Assumption but fraudulently intending to deceive her the s<sup>d</sup>  
Florence of the s<sup>d</sup> 2000<sup>l</sup> of tobaco & Cashe demised & still doth  
to pay the same Although often demanded the pt<sup>ie</sup> saith she is  
damified and hath dammage to the value of three thousand  
pounds of tobaco And hereupon brings his Suit &c

This Bill bindeth me John Anderson Sayer my heirs  
executors to pay to George Parker his heirs executors  
or assigns the summe of Two thousand pounds of  
good sound merchantable tobaco and Cashe to be  
paid upon demand conveniently in Perambok  
river to which I have sett my hand this 20<sup>th</sup> day  
of October 1668 This Bill to be paid one thousand
