refuse to pay the aforesaid summe of foure  
hundred pounds of Tobacco and Cash whereby  
the said Pearce is damaged and hath dam<sup>+</sup>idge  
to the value of eight hundred pounds of Tobacco  
and Cash and thereupon bring his Suite

This Bill bindeth me William Brown  
of Northampton County my heirs exors  
or assignes to pay or cause to be paid  
to Pearce Davis his heirs exors &c  
or assignes the full & just summe of  
foure hundred pounds of Tobacco & Cash  
according to the Act of Assembly in some  
place in Rungerb Creeke at or upon the  
tent<sup>h</sup> of November next ensuing the  
Date hereof at witness my hand the fourth  
Day of April 1670
