The deposition of Jarman Gilliot aged 50 years or thereabouts sworn and sworn that some time in the month of October last past George Eves deceased did buy of the said Gilliot five Coves and five Cakes for which he gave the said Gilliot for the said five Coves and five pounds of tobacco the fifty pounds of tobacco was spent in wine and the other thousand pounds of tobacco George Eves did pay for me to James Curill for which he past his bill unto the said Curill for the same and did see Doctor John Bigeroid and Mr Edward Shreeley at the same time set their hands as witnesses to the said bill & being indebted to the said Curill he gave me a receipt forty thousand pounds of tobacco and a very plain that John Hilliard did know of the same for that John Hilliard before that George Eves went home did presser several times for a being called in exchange of a horse with John Patrick and would be sensible of the same things that the deposition being the
