The Deposition of Arthurbad Erskine Murrill: 16<sup>th</sup> July 1677: Inq<sup>y</sup>ms the s<sup>d</sup> Arthurbad being all y<sup>e</sup> dwelling house of Mr David Browne of Mansarkin y<sup>e</sup> 16<sup>th</sup> this Instant & was present when Capt: Thomas Jones after many threatening words did lay violent hands on Richard Higgenbotham Taylor to thrust him out of doores being late at night & hee y<sup>e</sup> said Richard refusing to be gone hee being in y<sup>e</sup> present service of y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Browne was by y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Jones beaten severall blowes & after resistance made by y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Richard Higgenbotham & Feighton fell as for upon him untill parted by y<sup>e</sup> said Browne who being called commanded his s<sup>d</sup> to be gone: /

2 The Jones afores<sup>d</sup> laid hold upon y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Browne when parting Feighton & Higgenbotham & cut him a shute of his back & sides in severall parts calling him stoltz rogue & rebell with many threatening expressions saying y<sup>e</sup> hee had not a rooffe to cover his head. hee y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Jones having a better right to y<sup>e</sup> house & had gott possession of itt or some part of itt: 1: 1: 1:
