who saith upon his thid instant he heard Capt: Thomas Jones Capt: David Browne of Manoak in Stott
Regnall his selfe a rebell as also hys recent hys selfe in severall parts of hys selfe told Browne hys selfe had a
better right to hys house than he for hys selfe gott possession of hys house & further saith not: i.e.

The said August being present at hys dwelling house of Mr David Browne of Manoak in hys selfe last was present
when Capt: Thomas Jones & Richard Higgenbottome was fighting but how it began I know not but afterward I saw
X = + W^m: Egerton of Manoak after said fight so violently upon hys Richard hys selfe being attwo men a tailor there
in hys said Browne's house and hys Mr Browne coming & parting them commanding his m^t Capt: praeferred his self
violently to one of them hys hys Capt: Jones in severall peices cutting him Stott broune & man y old threatening words:

Ex: The said Jones & Egerton being gone returned about midnight hys selfe night with one man more & came about to
open hys doore or else hys selfe would break it open hys selfe aforesaid men I saw in hys party many great blows Richard
given against hys doore & further saith not: i.e. n. n. n. n. n. n.

thou were that went along with Capt: Thomas Jones & William Egerton on hys selfe last to Mr David
Browne the said Rendall Revell made oath upon hys holi Evangelists & saith hys Capt: Jones came over hys selfe
y^e miles from John Mynfield went along with him but from whence they came & whether they went I
know not & further saith not: i.e. n. n. n. n. n. n.

July 16th 1677:

William Hurnis complaineth hys selfe of hys last past (with his wife) was assaulted on hys road by
Capt: Thomas Jones & Edward Jones & was by them beaten & sorely bruised in so much y^e Capt: William
Hurnis foyt to remaine in his bed for severall daies not able to stir or liupe hys selfe much endangering
his life hys selfe is continually in dedili^r feare to go about amon his neigboris concerning hys selfe doulting hys selfe to
surprise him hys Capt: Jones is come (hys selfe believing) to gaigne hys selfe & doth therefore deside to gaigne
in peace against hys said Thomas & Edward Jones & that hys may be bound to their good behaviour: i.e.
