would desire you to take into serious Consideration: And further yo^r Let^r desires that his
servant may serve him according to the judgement of the w^r C^r for he Damages sustained
and yo^r Let^r as in ditz bound shall pray.

And the said Mary Pereman appears sworne her fath & knowes herselfe upon y^e Judg^m
of the Co^r this Co^r therefore do^r that the said Mary Pereman serve Randall Revell on his acco^r
eight moneths over & above the first huse of servite

appere the next Comity Co^r to be holden y^e 9th day of Jan^r next coming: And upon non
apperaunce being summond to paye eare person one thousand pounds of tobacco
