Whereas Capt. Henry Brouncker made a proposal to the said Justices to have a house or dwelling house
erected thereon and bounded by tobacco to be paid this present year out of County Down & five
hundred pounds of tobacco for the sum of Elizabeth Derington due to be paid by John Blundell as
security to be performed in the course of this decade Capt. John Blundell remitteth to the said Justices
that as fulfiling is promised unto them his consideration doth and shall have been paid unto him by Capt. Henry
Brouncker a sum of money to Capt. Henry Brouncker or his order twelve thousand pounds of tobacco
it is ordered that John Blundell ab security for Elizabeth Derington pay unto the said Capt. Henry
Brouncker five hundred pounds of tobacco the sum Capt. Henry Brouncker to furnish as costs to be
performed in said house well planted above ab sufficiente with good & substantial sleepers
in both the lower rooms the upper rooms to be divided into two the one west door of the house
will have hinged doors and steps stairs by east windowes carpenters joiners & turners work Ban
scated for dusting pinnelde tables. All other necessaries to y complishing of y said dwellinge /

Whereas Capt. Henry Brouncker made a proposal to this Court to build or cause to be built & finished
one sufficient dwelling house diverslye foot long & sixteene foot wide with an inside chimney ab
alasse one stable thirtye foot long diverslye foot & alasse wide with rath & maner for and in
consideration of the same all sumes to summing of twoe hundred pound value it is ordered that the
same shall be paid unto Capt. Henry Brouncker for the payment of his costes pay the sume unto Capt. Henry Brouncker in his
order in Dublin and that the said Capt. Henry Brouncker cause the said Blundell to be built accordingly
in the Countye Lancashire counte nowtly.

Whereas Thomas Newbold sonner demanded 250 pounds of tobacco out of County Down
for his sonne John due to him for setting on the Corpse of James Russ decayed flung downe by
