said Davis whom he did binde himselfe his heires & assigns & adm^r to the well & true performanc of

to y^e well & true performanc hereof I binde me my heires & assigns & adm^r firmly by this presents
to y^e Joseph Freeman his heires & assigns adm^r assignes witness my hand & seal this 15th day
of August 1693 / John Davis (seal)

And the said John Davis appeared this day to wit y^e 6th day of February Anno^{do} 1693 the Co^{rt}
then sitting & before them Conf^d Judge for 1250^l of tobacco due to Joseph Freeman whereupon the
Co^{rt} ordered that John Davis Carpenter pay unto Joseph Freeman or his ord^r Twelve hundred & fifty pounds
of tobacco with cost of his attorney
