WEE Doe therefore for quieting and settling of all matters and for the Laying of the County Levy for the last year which is not yett laid and the bringing to Tryall all matters and causes Declard publick and Order that the County Levy be laid the last Tuesday of this present Month of April and all Causes whatsoever come to Tryall in Juud Court as if the said Court had been Legally Adjourned both in January & March Courts last past and to sitt by and according to their last Comissions to which the Comissions haud been Legally Sworn without taking any Notice of a later Comission to which they haud not been Sworn. And which is hereby Superseaded and the former ordered to be in full force and vertue And it is hereby Ordered that the Sheriff of the said County of Sumersett forthwith make Publick Proclamation hereof in the most publick Places of the said County that all persons may take Notice of the same Given at S<sup>t</sup> Maries the 9<sup>th</sup> day of April 1689
