John Bounder brings his Serv^t Woman called Isabell Wilson the said maid coming into this province without Indenture and brought before this Court to be judged after a full view had and taken by this Court of the said Isabell Wilson they do adjudge her to be sixteen years of age from the date afores^t.

The petition of M^r William Craill Minister shewing how that he is setting up a New plantation on Pocomoke and that the first Clearers of the Main Roads there have not been well acquainted with the ground, for that the roads that now are, are bad way, and about, by what it may be made, and run through the middle of what ground your petitioner hath to clear for a corn field, your petitioner craves leave to alter the said Roads by his plantation at his own Charge, no other better way for the inhabitants therabouts who are likewise willing thereto & your petitioner will pray this Court having taken the premises into their consideration Ordered that if the petitioner performe according to the course of his petition, that he may alter the Roads as prayed provided it be no damage to the Neighbo^r or others

The petition of Thomas Wootherhead shewing how that he is in a poor weak condition by indisposition of health for which freash the Christiano Convalesce & also that he employed a doctor to cure him for w^t he was to give him a Ward and a Cott w^t said Ward and Cott the said Doctor by name James Steward took into his custody and the same did sell and dispose off to James Givon the the said Doctor did him no cure for that he prayes the Ward and Cott might be delivered him on a valuable Consideration Sive therof otherwise w^t he constrained to come on the Charity of the parish for a Maintenance and your petitioner will pray

James Givon and in Open Court declared that he w^t said the County harmles from affloring anything for a Maintenance to the s^r Thomas Wootherhead for that he the s^r James Givon w^t allow him a comfortable Livedhood —
