John Boudri brings his serv^t woman called Izabell Wilson the said maid coming into this province without Indenture and brought before this Court to be judged after a full view had and taken by this Court of the said Izabell Wilson they doo adjudge her to be sixteen yeares of age from the date afores^d.

The petition of m. William Traill Minister shewing how that he is settling of a new plantation on pocomoko and that the first clearers of the main Roads there have not been well acquainted with the ground, for that the roads that now is, is a bad way, and about, by what it may be made, and run through the middle of what ground your petitioner hath to clear for a corn field, your petitioner craves leave to alter the said Roads by his plantation at his own charge nearer & better way for the Inhabitants thereabouts who are likewise willing thereto & your petitioner will pray this Court having taken the premises into their consideration Ordered that if the petitioner performs according to the contents of his petition, that he may alter the Roads as prayed provided it be no damage to the Neighbors or Others

The petition of Thomas Weatherhead shewing how that he is in a poor & weak condition by indisposition of health for w^{ch} he craveth the Christian's benevolence & also that he employed a doctor to cure him for w^{ch} he was to give him a Mare and a Colt w^{ch} said Mare and Colt the said Doctor by name James Steward took into his custody and the same did sell and dispose off to James Gwon the said Doctor did him no cure so that he prays the Mare and Colt might be delivered him or a valuable consideration in view thereof otherwise w^d be constrained to come on the Charity of the parish for a maintenance and your petitioner will pray James Gwon and in open Court declared that he w^d save the County harmless from allowing anything for a maintenance to the s^d. Thomas Weatherhead for that he the s^d. James Gwon w^d allow him a competent livelihood &c.
