

The petition of Willimott Hill shewing how that she had kept one Thomas Clark ever since he was one year old and never since hath been allowed any thing for the said he being an Orphan humbly prays that your petitioners may have allowance for the said otherwise that he might be bound over to your petitioner according to Act of Assembly & your petitioner will pray - - -

Chio Court having taken the promised into Consideration Ordered that the said Thomas Clark remaine with the said Willimott Hill and her to serve in such Servitude as she or heire will Employ him untill he attains to one & twenty yeares of age according to Act of Assembly and further Ordered that the said Willimott Hill give unto the afores<sup>d</sup> Thomas Clark a few neat yeares the said Cow with her increase both male and female to remaine and be for the use of the said Thomas Clark and his heire or Assignes for ever, w<sup>ch</sup> the said Willimott Hill in open Court did promise to doe & it being in Consideration of his said Servitude and further that she allow him Sufficient Meate Drinke washing Lodging and apparrell during the said time of his Servitude &c.

The Petition of Margaritt Reed shewing how that she served her time of Servitude to Lawrence Cranford of Locomoake River for w<sup>ch</sup> there is bound due to yo<sup>r</sup> petitioners by the Custom of the Countrey as by a certaine Act of Assembly Entitled an Act Relating to Servants and Slaves made Anno 1666: a good Coath Suite either of K<sup>ing</sup> or broadcloth a shift of white Linin to be New one paire of New Shoes & blockins & three B<sup>ushels</sup> of Indian Corne all w<sup>ch</sup> your petitioner have Modestly demanded of the afores<sup>d</sup> Lawrence Cranford her late Master but he fraudulently and purposely intended to deceive your petitioner of the afores<sup>d</sup> Corne and Coathes have refused to pay & still doth deny to pay the said your petitioner humbly prays for Order that the provision as above may be made her according to Law and as in Duty bound will pray - - -

Chio Court having this day the promised taken into Consideration and finding that Lawrence Cranford afores<sup>d</sup> is not present to answer for hims<sup>lf</sup> unto the petition afores<sup>d</sup> Ordered that the afores<sup>d</sup> Lawrence Cranford appear next Court to be holden the 2<sup>d</sup> Tuesday in August next there to answer unto the Complaint of the afores<sup>d</sup> Margaritt Reed &c.

The Petition of Mad<sup>m</sup>. Elizabeth Stevono and M<sup>r</sup>. Edmund Howard shewing how that some ill affected persons to your petitioners have lately made and still do make a horse Road to Pohoboth Cowind through the Lands of your petitioners to the great damage and prejudice of your petitioners and therefore do humbly desire that the Old Road to the said Cowind may be Ordered to be continued which hath been a Road this twenty odd yeares and your petitioners as in duty bound will pray
