

The Petition of Mabel Bouds desiring that a fine of five hundred pounds of Cobes laid on her might be remitted, but the said Mabel Bouds having judicially committed some misdemour in Court sitting Ordered that the Sheriff take her into his Custody and further Ordered that the said Mabel Bouds do fynd five hundred pounds of Cobes for her Insolency in Court, but upon Motion made to this Court by her husband John Bouds As well for her Release as for the Remission of her fynd it was then and there Orderd as also Concluded and agreed to and with the said John Bouds that provided he would make or cause to be made a New ducking Stool the said to be strong and Substantiall and that at his own Cost and Charge and that he keepe the said ducking Stool in good Repair during the space of six yeares from the date hereof and the said ducking Stool to be put up neare the Court house where the Old ducking Stool now standeth - That upon that Consideration his wife Mabel Bouds should be releas'd as also her fynd Remitted as prayd

Cause the aforesd. John Bouds and in open Court did Oblidge himselfe in the penalty of three thousand pounds of Cobes to this worshipfull Court for to performe all the Cause and Articles abovesaid and that further he would have the said ducking Stool of fynd and Substantiall by the second Ewoday in August next Yc - -

Cause James English in his proper person and pleaded not guilty and for beyall put himselfe to the Court.

Whereupon it is day to with the 11th day of June in the xiiijth year of the Dominion of the R^h hon^{ble} Charles the first Annoq^{ue} Domij 1689 Considered and Ordered by this Court that the said James English be fynd according to the rules of Court for breach of Sabbath or Act of Assembly - As also that he give good and sufficient Security for his behav^r during pleasure Cause the aforesaid James English with his Sureties Augustin Standford and Roger Burkum and in open Court did Acknowledge themselves to stand bound unto the R^h hon^{ble} the Lord prop^{ty} viz. the said James English in the Sum of Ten pounds Sterl. and Augustin Standford and Roger Burkum in the Sum of five pounds Sterl. a piece to be Seaverd on their goods and Chattels Land and Emowments for the use of the Lord prop^{ty} aforesd.
