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Or moate soe found tog-ather with the said person Or persons with whom the same shall be found b-fore the next magistrato for this County that soe he or they may be proceeded ag^t according to Law faile not as you will answer the contrary Given vnder my hand at Wiccombe in the County afores^d this 26th day of October 1688 Wm Brereton

Thomas Gordon deputed to search as afores^d and to make return of this warrant.

By virtue of the above warrant upon search was found in the plantation belonging to William Colliu and Lawrence Young John Kemp sojourning with them October the 27th 28th 1688 a forty gallon cask of pork hid in a new brush fenced vnder an Old Creepe one hoggs gutts fresh by the back side by Lawrence Youngs in Colliu patale patch was found one hoggs gutts buried tog-ather with Siner and Sights in a wall neare Youngs house was found three hoggs gutts one hoggs harslett and the Cere and fat upon all of them in Colliu house two fitches of Bacon green two gords of ffatt and some young porks salted at Lawrence Youngs a side of Bacon and some young porks salted in a Creepe hid in the Doug hill and covered with wood In the said Youngs house several doarts of Meats and did seeme to be killed at severall times In the wall at Lawrence Youngs where the hoggs gutts was found were the horns of ab-ast about ay-ard and a halfe old and one horn of ab-ast of about a y-ard old tog-ather with haire and Callow &c.

The said day viz^t the 12th day of June in the enyth y-ard of the Douison of the Rth hono^r Charles the Amogr Douy 1689 came the afores^d Lawrence Young and John Kemp in their proper persons and pleaded not guilty and for their Creyall put themselves upon the Countrey whereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of this County to cause to come here twelve good and Lawfull men of his Bayliwick by whom &c and who either or to recognize &c because as well &c Now here at this day to wit the 12th day of June as aforesaid came the parties afores^d and the Jurors of that Jury likewise came viz^t John King Rowland Brewster Robert Smith John Cowse and s^r John Emmett John Swain John Bowen William Clark son George Chabue George Bosman Walter Taylor and Henry Hayman who being Elowed they do and Swore to say the truth in the premisses upon their oaths do say wee the Jury doe find for my Lord properly ag^t Lawrence Young but find John Kemp not guilty of matter of fact Whereupon it is ordered by this Court that the said Lawrence Young stand in the pillory for two hours tog-ather as also that he pay to the persons grieved four shewls according to act of assembly and the Meats found in his possession now in the Custody of Cap^t Jm. Windsor be tak-ⁿ in part paym^t of the said four shewls by the persons soe grieved the said Cap^t John Windsor being ordered to pay the said Meats when demanded and it is further ordered by this Court that the said Lawrence Young and John Kemp give good and sufficient security as well for their behav^r and app-ear-ance every Court during pleasure as for the paym^t of officers fees Came the aforesaid Lawrence Young and acknowledged himself in open Court to stand indebted unto the Rth hono^r the Lord properly in the sum of thirty pounds Sterling and John Bouds Andrew Whittington his Sureties each in fifteen pounds Sterling agreed to be sequestrated on their goods Chattels Lands and Com-movents for the use of the Lord properly afores^d The Condition being such that if the above bounden Lawrence Young shall twice be of the good behav^r & ab-ar-ance and make his personall app-ear-ance every Court during pleasure as also pay all officers fees then the above obligation to be void &c
