By virtue of the above warrant upon search was found in the plantation belonging to William Collins and Lawrence Young John Kump Soverning with them October the 27th 28th 1688 a forty gallon pasko of porks hid in a New brush fence under an Old tree one hoggs gutts fresh by the back side by Lawrence Youngs in Collins pasture patch was found One hoggs gutts buried together with Liver and Lungs in a well hoard Youngs house was found Three hoggs gutts One hoggs heart and the Lale and fat upon all of them in Collins house Two flitchs of Bacon green two gords of fat and some young porks salted at Lawrence Youngs a side of Bacon and found young porks salted in a tree hid in the Doug hill and bound with wood In the said Youngs house several sorts of meat and did seem to be killed at several times In the well at Lawrence Youngs where the hoggs gutts was found were the horns of a bull about ay=ard and a halfe Old and One horn of a bull of about 3=ard Old together with hairs and Callow etc.

The same day viz the 12th day of June in the eyre year of the Dominion of the R. hunc. Charles the 1st among June 1689 came the aforesay Lawrence Young and John Kump in their proper persons and pleaded not guilty and for their tryall put themselves upon the Country Whereupon Command was given to the Sheriff of this County to cause to come here twelve good and lawfull men of his County by whom and who neither cr. to recognize cr. be caused to come Now heretofore at this day to wit the 12th day of June as aforesaid came the parties aforesay and the Jurors of that Jury likewise came viz John King Rowland Beeton Robert Smith John Cowlesend Jr. John Emmett John Swain John Bowen William Clarkson George Hobson George Bosman Walter Taylor and Henry Hayman who being sworn & arrayed and sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their oaths do say wee the Jury do find for my Lord proprie of Lawrence Young but find John Kump not guilty of matter of fact Whereupon it is ordered by this Court that the said Lawrence Young stand in the pillory for two hours together as also that he pay to the persons grieved four fowle according Coat of Assembly and the meat found in his possession now in the custody of Capl. Jn. Winsor be taken in part payme of the said four fowle by the persons for grieved the said Capl. John Winsor being ordered to pay the said meat when demanded and it is further Ordered by this Court that the said Lawrence Young and John Kump give good and sufficient security as well for their behav. and appearance every Court during pleasure as for the payme of officers for cause the aforesaid Lawrence Young and acknowledged himself in Open Court to stand indebted unto the R. hunc the 2nd day of July in the sum of thirty pounds Sterling and John Bounds Esq Andrew Whittington his Sureties each in fifteen pounds Sterling apid to be laid on their goods & Chattel Lands and Commitments for the use of the Lord proprie aforesay

This Indemnity being made that if the above bounden Lawrence Young shall be of the goods & chattels of the aforesay and make his personal appearance every Court during pleasure as also pay all Officers fees then the above Obligation to be void etc
