The Condition being such that if the abouor^s Lawrence Young be of the good behav^r and abar=and towards all good people and more especially within this County of Sundsett and that he mak= his personall appar=and euery Court during pleasur as also pay all officers fees then the abouor^s obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force.

Caused John Broude and in open Court did oblig^d himself to said Andrew Whittington harmless from all damages that may accrued or come on him for the non paym^t of officers fees due from Lawrence Young &c.

The Jur^os for the Rth hon^{ble} the Lord prop^{ty} being Sworne upon the holy & Evang^list at a grand Jury hold for the body of this County the second Tuesday In November last past doo present and finde that Jos-ph Boyce of this County plaunt^r Not hausing the feare of God nor respect to his sacred and diuine Lawes and Comandms. And ag^t the good and wholesome Lawes & Institucions of this prouince in Contempt of his Lordpp^s Lawes hath spoken most Maliciously and Contumptiously both of his person and Authority at the house of Ambrose London and els^e where on the 25th day of Aprill last past by thos^e words Swearing by God that his Dogg should make a better Comissioner then any of them that word Sworne Naunting Thomas Joud and King saying further what word they but apack of Rogues = whereby the said Boyce hath end=auored what in him layeth to bring his Lordpp^s Lawes and Authority in Contempt and Rais^e Sedicion ag^t his Lordpp^s amongst the people and ag^t the w=ald and peace of this prouince his Lordpp^s Attourney Craues Judg^{mt} may be outord ag^t the offend^r as in Law is prouid^d in that Case &c.

The said day viz^t the 12th day of June in the 1th y=ard of his Lordpp^s Dominion &c. Annoq^{ue} Domⁱⁿⁱ 1689 Caused the aforesaid Jos-ph Boyce in his proper person and pleaded not guilty and for his Crayall put himself upon the Country

Upon which Comand was given to the Sheriff of this County to cause to come hore eu=and good and Lawfull men of his Bayliwick by whom &c. and who neither &c. for orogⁿiz^e &c. because as w=ll &c. Now hore at this day to witt the 12th day of June as afores^d. Caused the afores^d Jos-ph Boyce to the Barre and the Jurors of that Jury likewise Caused viz^t John West William Doncom John Heath Wm Richardson Hopo Taylor Thomas Morris John Joud Marsey ffountain John ffredman Walter Talbot John Banker and Matthew Scarbrough who being eld^d Creyd and Swore to say the truth In the pr^ouiss^e upon their Oath doo say w^o of the Jury doo finde Jos-ph Boyce not guilty Whereupon it was ordered by this Court that the said Jos-ph Boyce giue forthwith security as w=ll for his behav^r as for his appar=and euery Court during pleasur as also for the paym^t of Officers fees &c.

Caused Jos-ph Boyce with his Sureties Edward Joud and William Warwick and did acknowledge themselves to stand indebted to the Rth hon^{ble} the Lord prop^{ty} viz^t Jos-ph Boyce in the sum of Cherty pound Sterling and Edward Joud & Wm. Warwick in the sum of fiftion pound Sterling apiece to be Seaued on their goods & Chattels Lands & Emments for the use of the Lord prop^{ty} afores^d.
